Service to Education

This DKG sister has served her chapter as webmaster, Zoom master, and by making many presentations. She has served as a State president, attended several regional conferences, and has presented workshops. In fact, she was a workshop presenter at the conference.

She is Professor of Early Childhood and Special Education at Western Oregon University. She is collaborating to develop a state-wide Center for Early Childhood that focuses on justice, equity, and inclusion. She is on a state level leadership team for early childhood inclusion. She organized an exchange at Western Oregon University with students from China. She has been director of the Early Childhood Inclusion Summer Institute. She created a bridge program for transferring community college students to Western Oregon University. She works with the Marion/Polk Early Learning Hub, the NW Down Syndrome Association, and has served on the Chemeketa Community College Early Childhood Advisory Board. She is currently serving on the Early Intervention/Early Childhood Special Education Higher Education Consortium. She is active on many more councils and in many professional organizations. 



